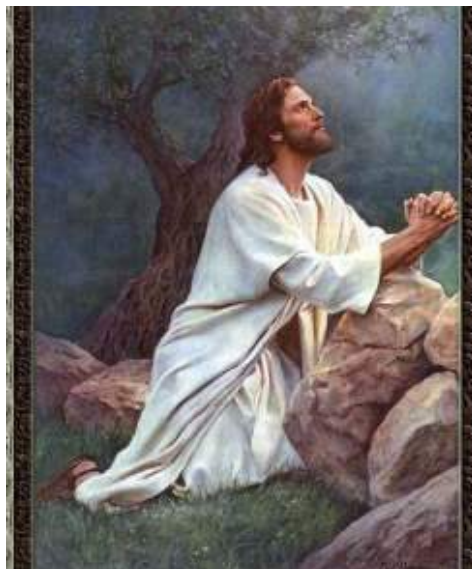
Saint Augustin famously prayed that God's grace should help to make him chaste but as he said...NOT YET.
